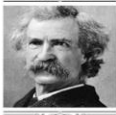


Samuel Langhorne Clemens (Mark Twain)



Samuel Langhorne Clemens was born on 30 November 1834. He is better known by his pen name Mark Twain. He was an American author and humorist. He grew up in Hannibal, Missouri, which would later provide the living place for Huckleberry Finn and Tom Sawyer.

He appeared with a printer. He also worked as a reporter and contributed articles to his older brother Orion's newspaper. After sailing as a printer in various cities, he became a steam boiler pilot on the Mississippi River before heading west to join Orion.

He was a failure at gold mining, so he went turned to journalism. Being a reporter, he wrote a humorous story, "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County," which became very popular and brought nationwide attention. His newspaper work also well received.

He achieved great success as a writer and public speaker. Though he earned a great deal of money from his writings and lectures, he invested in ventures that lost a great deal of money, notably the Paige Compositor, which failed because of its complexity and impracticality.

Twain was born during a visit by Halley's Comet, and he predicted that he would "go out with it." He died on 21 April 1910, the day following the comet's subsequent return.

He was lauded as the "greatest American humorist of his age," and William Faulkner called him "the father of American literature."
